


ACTIVITY 1: GO OBSERVING




USING THE LIVERPOOL TELESCOPE


1. Click the option for 'Go Observing'.

Go Observing

Choosing a part of the Moon

The telescope in the Schools' Observatory can see a lot of detail on the surface of the Moon, but only for a bit of the Moon at a time.

Click on the image below to choose which part of the Moon to observe




The lighter part of the moon is visible at the moment so if you click somewhere in that area your picture will be taken sooner. If you click a darker area of the moon you might be waiting longer than your friends!

The next page gives you a little summary of what you have chosen so far and tells you what settings the telescope will use to take your Moon picture.
